**RESOLUTION APPROVING THE PURCHASE OF LED STOP SIGNS, IMPACT
PEDESTRIAN SIGNS AND LIGHT UP PEDESTRIAN SIGNS**

WHEREAS, the Department of Traffic and Parking Meters (“Department”) recommends that the City of Wildwood (the “City”) procure LED Stop signs, Impact Pedestrian signs and Light up Pedestrian signs for the City; and

WHEREAS, the Department has researched vendors and determined that the sought-after equipment may be procured through a state-recognized and accepted cooperative purchasing contract between Somerset County Cooperative Pricing System #2SOCCP and National Highway Products; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 52:34-6.2b.(3)* (as amended by *P.L. 2011, c.139*) and LFN 2012-10, a New Jersey municipality may purchase goods and services without public bidding under the Local Public Contracts Law through the use of a nationally-recognized and accepted cooperative purchasing contract that has been developed utilizing a competitive bidding or contracting process by another contracting unit within New Jersey or another state; and

WHEREAS, the subject cooperative purchasing contract was awarded by Somerset County Cooperative Pricing System #2SOCCP to National Highway Products utilizing a competitive contracting process; and

WHEREAS, also pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 52:34-6.2b.(3)* (as amended by *P.L. 2011, c.139*) and LFN 2012-10, prior to making purchases under state-recognized and accepted cooperative purchasing contracts, the municipality must determine that the use of the cooperative purchasing contract shall result in cost savings after all factors, including charges for service, material, and delivery, have been considered; and

WHEREAS, the Department has determined that the City’s use of the Somerset County Cooperative Pricing System #2SOCCP cooperative purchasing contract to procure the aforementioned equipment will result in cost savings to the City; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the Somerset County Cooperative Pricing System #2SOCCP cooperative purchasing contract and needs of the City, National Highway Products has submitted proposals for LED Stop signs, Impact Pedestrian signs and Light up Pedestrian to the City for the sum of \$146,462.52; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that sufficient funds are available for this purchase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Wildwood, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The foregoing “WHEREAS” clauses are hereby incorporated as if fully restated.
2. A contract for the purchase of LED Stop signs, Impact Pedestrian signs and Light up Pedestrian signs for the City for the sum of \$146,462.52 is hereby awarded to National highway Products without public bidding as permitted by law.
3. If required, the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute an “End User Agreement” with National Highway Products pursuant to the terms of its state-recognized and accepted cooperative purchasing agreement with the Somerset County Cooperative Pricing System #2SOCCP.
